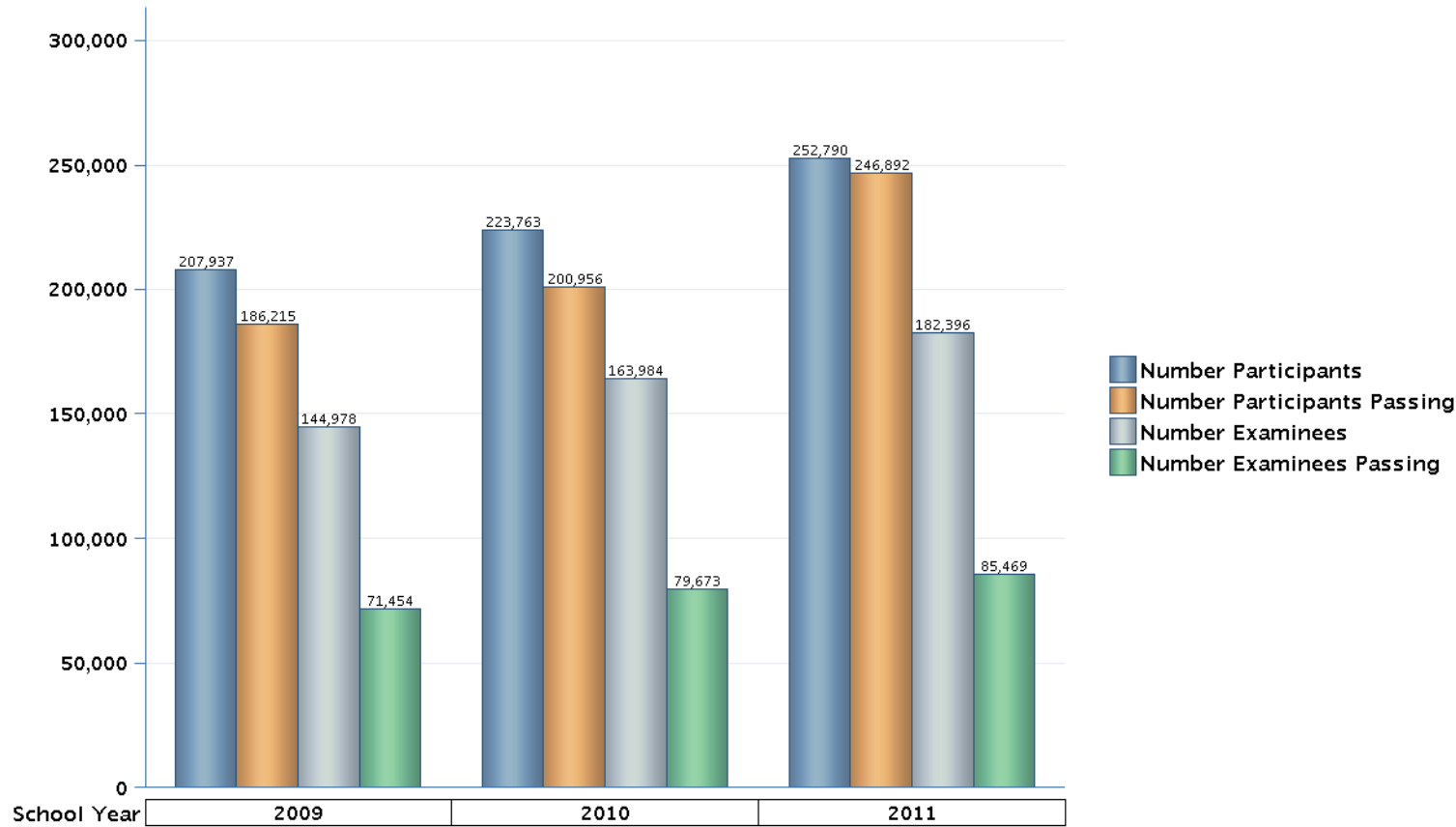

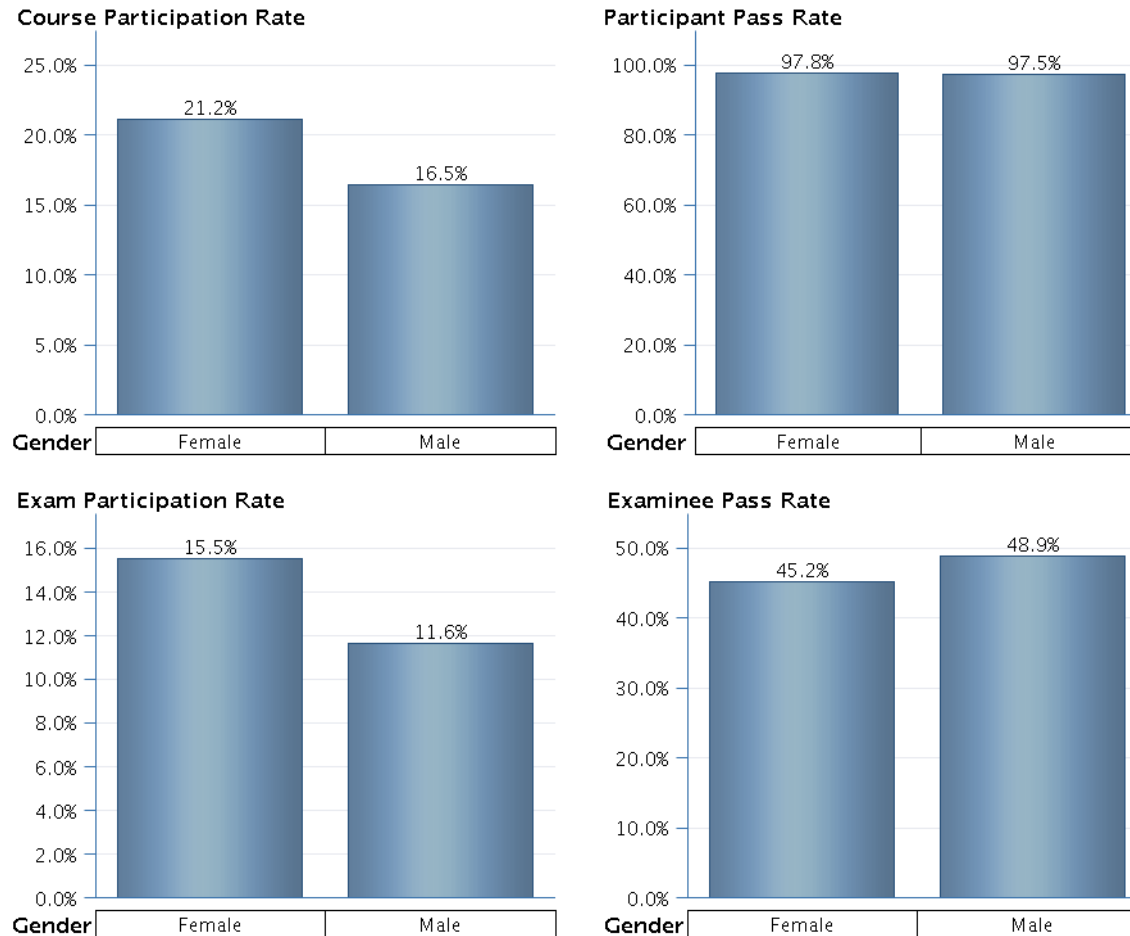

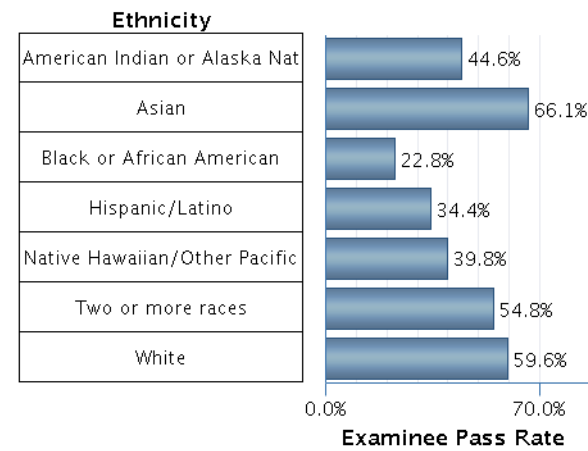
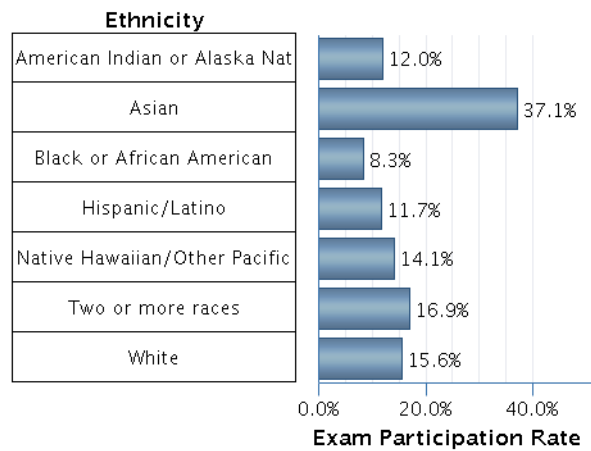
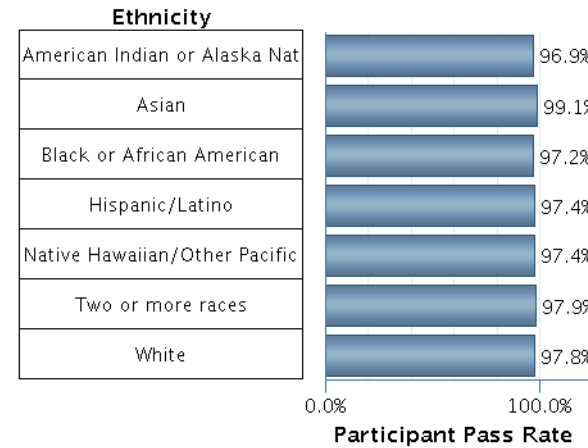
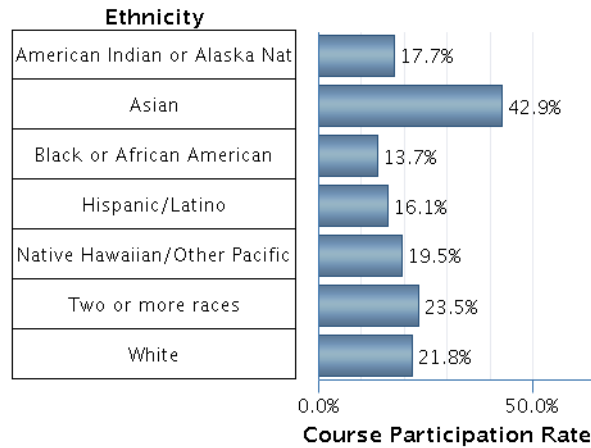

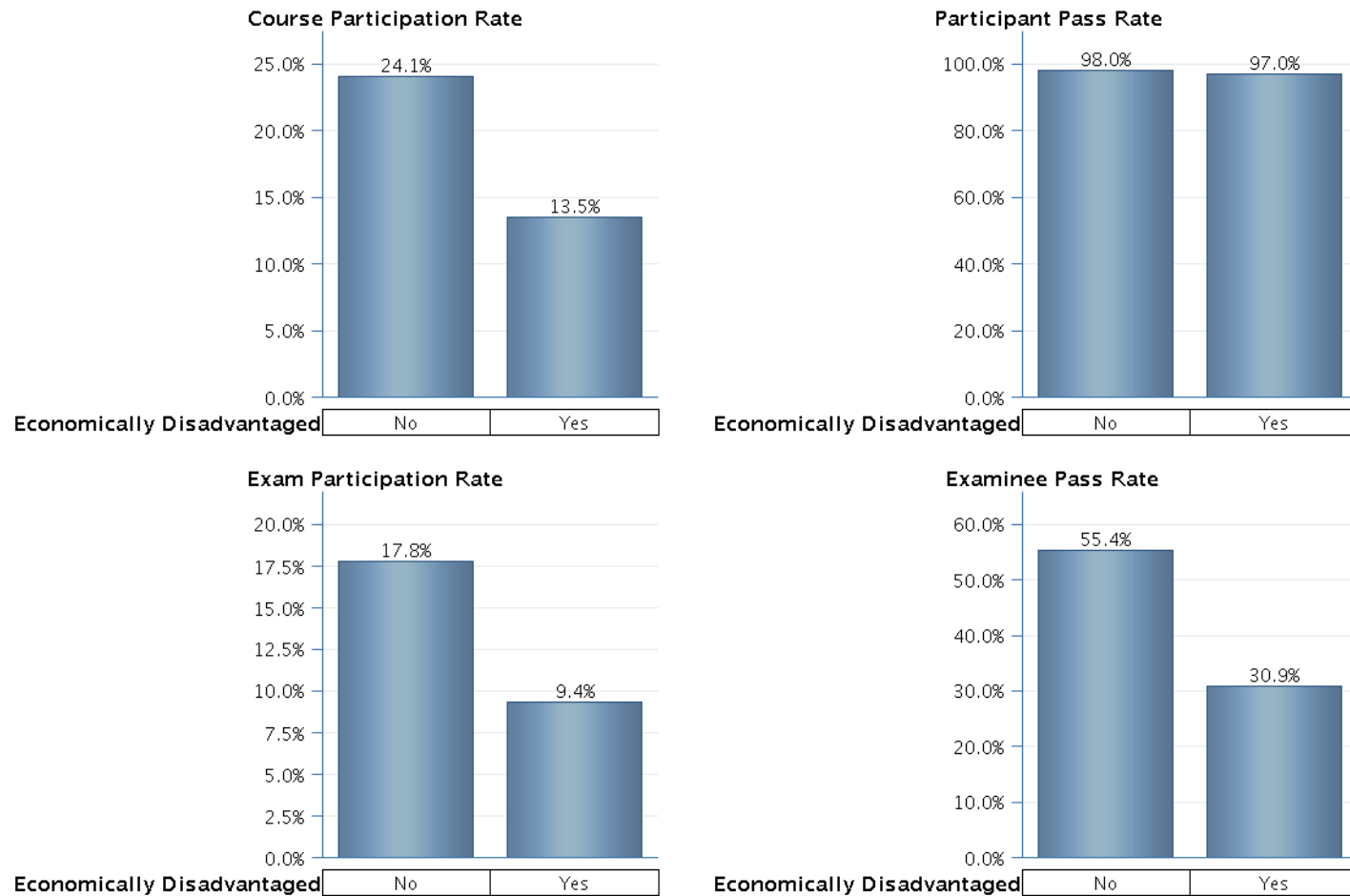

<b>Purpose</b>	<p>This report provides information about Texas high school students who complete Advanced Placement (AP) courses and AP exams. It also examines participation and pass rates for students by gender, ethnicity and economically disadvantaged status.</p> <p>Data in this report are reported at the statewide level.</p>
<b>Data Source</b>	<p>Advanced Placement (AP) test data for Texas public high school examinees were provided to the Texas Education Agency (TEA) by the College Board. Student gender, ethnicity, and economically disadvantaged status were obtained from the TEA Public Education Information Management System (PEIMS). The College Board also collects these information and were used when they were not available in PEIMS.</p>
<b>Data Elements</b>	
<b>Advanced Placement (AP)</b>	<p>The AP program is a cooperative educational endeavor between secondary schools and colleges and universities. It is designed to enroll high school students in college-level courses. AP courses are developed locally and taught by high school teachers, based on course information provided by the College Board.</p>
<b>School Year</b>	<p>Each school district must, by state law, operate so that the district provides at least 180 days of instruction for students during the school year, generally from September to June. For example, school year 2008 refers to September 2007 to June 2008.</p>
<b>Number Students</b>	<p>The number of students enrolled in Grade 9 through Grade 12 in the Texas public school system as of the Fall Snapshot date (the last Friday in October) of each year. The student enrollment counts include any student served by a public school district including charter schools but does not include the Texas School for the Deaf, Texas School for the Blind and Visually Impaired, or the Texas Youth Commission schools.</p>
<b>Number Examinees</b>	<p>The number of students taking AP exams. Students taking more than one AP exam are counted only once. Data include exams in all AP subject areas.</p>

<b>Exam Participation Rate</b>	The exam participation rate is the number of examinees divided by the number of students.
<b>Number Examinees Passing</b>	The number of examinees who passed at least one AP exam. A test grade of 3 or above is considered as passing.
<b>Examinee Pass Rate</b>	The examinee pass rate is the number of examinees passing divided by the number of examinees.
<b>Number Participants</b>	The number of students completing AP courses. Students completing more than one AP course are counted only once. Data include exams in all AP course areas.
<b>Course Participation Rate</b>	The course participation rate is the number participants divided by the total number of enrolled students.
<b>Number Participants Passing</b>	The number of students who passed at least one AP course.
<b>Participant Pass Rate</b>	The participant pass rate is the number of participants passing divided by the number of participants.
